**7:20** **Clean Water Services Integrated Municipal Watershed-Based Permit Part 3**  
This is the third in a three-part series on Clean Water Services Integrated Municipal Watershed-Based Permit. Issued in 2004, the permit was the first of its kind in the nation and represented a major change in the regulatory framework in support of integrated water resources management. This permit signaled a recognition of, and movement towards, an integrated regulatory framework for the management of point source and stormwater on a watershed scale. Staff will provide an overview of how the permit has been implemented over the last decade and what we can expect in the new permit.
